Definitions:

- Dictator
 - A person with power over the state with no checks or balances.
 - Benevolent dictator?
- Despotism
 - Dictator who oppresses people under their control.
- Nationalism
 - Extreme pride for a nation that inspires loyalty and devotion for the nation's culture, people, military, and laws.

➤ Fascism

- “Ultrnationalism of some variety (ethnic, religious, cultural), with the nation represented in the person of an authoritarian leader who speaks on its behalf.” - Jason Stanley, *How Fascism Works*
- i.e. Dictator + Despotism + Nationalism = Fascism

➤ Totalitarianism

- “Decisive in our context is that totalitarian government is different from dictatorships and tyrannies... for total domination is the only form of government with which coexistence is not possible. (Hence, we have every reason to use the word ‘totalitarian’ sparingly and prudently).” - Hannah Arendt, *The Origins of Totalitarianism*
